## **Newly Named Undersea Integration Program Office Hosts Change of Command Dec. 10**

SAN DIEGO – Program Executive Office for Command, Control, Communications, Computers and Intelligence (PEO C4I) will hold a change of command for the Undersea Integration Program Office (PMW 770) at 10 a.m., Dec. 10.

In an effort to better align to the Chief of Naval Operations' (CNO) vision to achieve Information Dominance, PMW 770, formerly the Submarine Integration Program Office, was designated the Undersea Integration Program Office effective Dec. 1. This tactical change will improve the alignment of innovative efforts and resources with the CNO's warfighting priorities, and will remove barriers that would otherwise inhibit the program executive office's ability to deploy enhanced capabilities to warfighters.

"The Undersea Integration Program Office will be the first program office to deliver Information Dominance architecture to a wide range of undersea systems and sensors - both manned and unmanned," said Navy Capt. Dean Richter, PMW 770 program manager. "The Navy as a whole is changing, and Team SPAWAR is taking a synergistic approach in achieving the CNO's vision of Information Dominance," he said.

Richter will be recognized for his leadership of PMW 770 in the delivery of C4I systems to submarines and ashore broadcast facilities, as well as connecting the undersea environment.

Assuming command is Capt. Miguel San Pedro, former officer-in-charge of SPAWAR Systems Activity Pacific in Hawaii. The guest speaker will be Rear Adm. Jerry K. Burroughs, Program Executive Officer for C4I.
